A Note From Pastor Kendall: The Grace of Community

If I were to say the term, Christian Community, what comes to mind? Maybe some vague picture of people all sitting around singing Kumbaya together. Maybe an idealistic picture of believers worshiping, serving, and doing life together in perfect harmony. Maybe the Biblical example of Acts 2:42-47 comes to mind--believers one in heart and mind, gathering in each other's homes, praying, reading the Scriptures, giving to support anyone in need. Oftentimes, we have this idea of community that we want to see, but reality doesn't even come close to measuring up. Because in reality, Christian community involves people. People who are sinners in need of a Savior (like we are). Whenever we come together as sinners in need of a Savior, there are bound to be problems. We just don't vibe with that person. We've known that person too long and will never see them as more than who they were when they were teenagers. We argue over convictions and preferences. We are easily offended and too easily offend others. Keep reading in Acts and we see quickly that even with this wonderful description of Christian community there are so many problems for them to sort through. So when we don't see the picture of community we dream of, we can be left disappointed or disillusioned with the people God has called us to be in community with.

It reminds me of a quote I read this week from Dietrich Bonhoeffers' *Life Together: The Classic Exploration of Christian Community*. Now Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and seminary professor during the 1930-1940s. He is probably most famous for his fierce resistance of Hitler and Nazism, even being put to death for his resistance. But his theological work on community is what I remember most from him. Life Together, which I HIGHLY recommend (it's a short and pretty easy read!), challenges our ideas of what we think Christian community SHOULD be, and helps us see a bigger picture of what Christian community really is. Listen to the quote:

"The person who loves their dream of community will destroy community, but the person who loves those around them will create community."

When we have a picture in our minds of what community is supposed to be and try to get God and others to fit our vision, we're bound to mess it up and call it a failure. We may even blame others, crushing them under the weight of our unrealistic expectations. So if the love of community lets us down, we must instead learn to love the real people God has already placed around us. Only in genuine love for people will we build community. Community is not something we can manufacture on our own. It is a spiritual reality in the grace and forgiveness of Christ Bonhoeffer also says,

"Even when sin and misunderstanding burden the communal life, is not the sinning brother still a brother, with whom I, too, stand under the Word of Christ? Will not his sin be a constant occasion for me to give thanks that both of us may live in the forgiving love of God in Jesus Christ?"

While we don't celebrate sin, what we can celebrate is that in our sins we have the opportunity to demonstrate the grace of Christ to one another, reminding each other of the grace and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. Christian community is where we point others to our shared salvation in Jesus. As a church we're looking to better foster that type of love in community. But it takes the Spirit of God helping us to see the saving work of God through Jesus Christ in one another, loving them the way God loves us. Only in that spirit of love may we become a stronger Christian community.



Update from the Starkenburgs in Nicaragua

In their Christmas letter update, the Starkenburgs gave us some updates about their school:

- There is a total of 984 students currently enrolled at the three schools that make up Nicaragua Christian Academy, with the historical total of 3,681 students who have attended NCA schools.
- NCA International is in its 34th year since its foundation in 1991.
- 22 countries are represented in the student body
- 93 missionary kids (MKs) attend, with a historical total of
 525 MKs attending over the years

- Belen and Asher played a lot of soccer and Asher participated in an international tournament in Honduras
- Liam, Caleb, Judah, and Asher led worship playing various instruments, such as piano, drums, ukulele, bass, and electric guitar

Update from the Spalinks



As they mentioned in their last newsletter, Larry and Ruth are retiring from Resonate. Larry reflected how when was 27 years old, his seminary studies were ending and he mentioned to Ruth about talking to Christian Reformed World Missions. Now at 72 years old, he and Ruth and back in the United States after serving for 45 years in Japan. They are currently staying with Ruth's mom in Pennsylvania. The Spalinks hope to visit supporting churches to give updates on what has been going on.

One of Larry's main ministries during the past few years in Japan involved helping churches grow and create better evangelism. Larry noted that the church in Japan is aging and shrinking, as is the Japanese population. For example, one church, Kawagoe Reformed Church, has two elders and they both turned 80 this year. Larry recently heard from a Pastor that one new elder and two new deacons were going to join the church's council. He also heard from another Pastor at Tokorazwa New Life Church that two of Larry's former Sunday School students were going to make Profession of Faith and baptize a child.

For continued missions in Japan, Perrin and Jodi Werner are taking over most of Larry and Ruth's work. Another couple, Charles and Hensel Oh, will be transferring from service in the Philippines to Japan this year as well. There are plans for one or two church plants, as well as initiatives for outreach towards the increasing non-Japanese population in the country.

For financial support, the Spalinks' work with Resonate will continue through May and Resonate will continue to accept donations for them through April. Larry also asks that you consider supporting the new missionaries in Japan, the Werners and the Ohs.
