A Note From Pastor Kendall: Resting in Christmastide

Just like that, the big day has come and gone. How was Christmas for you this year? Was it a let-down this year? Is your heart full or disappointed? When I was a kid I was always disappointed that the magic of Christmas was kind of over by now. Maybe you're exhausted from all the activity and preparations. Maybe you're trying to get your house back in order. Maybe the tree is already down. Maybe you're already trying to set your eyes on the new year. If we're not careful, we can too quickly turn the page on Christmas. But make no mistake--the season of Christmastime has only begun.

You've probably heard of the Twelve Days of Christmas. There's even a song about the twelve days. You know, the one with all the geese, the swans, the calling birds, the French hens, turtle doves and the partridge in a pear tree. I'm still not exactly sure why someone would want all those birds, but that's the song. Traditionally the Twelve Days of Christmas actually begin on Christmas Day, not conclude with it. Christmas is meant to continue past the big day. In the church calendar we call it Christmastide. It's the twelve days after Christmas. In fact, some traditions carry that season much longer than others, but the point is the same. We're not supposed to just rush through one day and move on to the next thing. We're meant to slow down and savor the meaning of Christmas now. In fact, I think this is the best time to really enjoy the holiday of Christmas. It can be easy to get too caught up in all the things leading up to Christmas—the shopping and the gifts, the parties, the decorations, the food and preparations. Those can all be wonderful things, but when do we find the time to rest in the meaning of Christmas? If Christ has come as the Savior of the world and we're reminded of his great grace, that should cause us to slow down from our need to be busy, to be productive, to do all things we NEED to do, in order to receive the ultimate gift of salvation. I think we need to learn how to rest in that new reality.

Let's not be in such a rush to move on in our lives that we miss out on slowing down to savor the reason for the season--we have been set free from sin and death, free from our failure to earn salvation, free from the burdens of this world and set free to live with God. In eternity we will experience the ultimate rest of knowing we belong to God Almighty forever. Christmas is supposed to be the first taste of that reality here on earth. God invites us this season to slow down, to remember that Christ has come, that he lived, died, rose again, went to heaven and left us his Spirit so we would know the joy and rest of the presence of God. Let's slow down and savor the rest of Christmastide.

Update from the Gryglewiczs



Prayer Requests

- Pray for the safety of those in Haiti. Since the end of October, there was a huge increase in gang
 and violent activity and political events that reflected this. There were massacres caused by
 gangs, resulting in over 100 people being killed. One staff member who leads an Impact club had
 to flee her home with her family due to gangs coming into the community and lighting houses on
 fire and shooting.
- Please pray for the safety of the Impact Clubs in Haiti and for the safety of their students, leaders, coaches, and families.
- Please also pray for the IMPACT clubs that are closed, such as in Port-au-Prince and Gros-Morne.
- The past few years, but the past few months in particular, have been hard for Johnny. He has been feeling the impact mentally and now physically as well. It's connected to everything that happened during the last few months in Haiti and the updates he has been getting from the staff still there. He was supposed to go on a trip to visit the staff in October, but it was cancelled at the last minute, which was devastating for Johnny. Please pray for Johnny during this time.

Prayer Praises

- In the last quarter, 25 active IMPACT clubs have been received regular club visits and assistance. During this quarter, they also welcomed 426 members and 51 leaders in the 25 active clubs.
- 151 boys and 275 girls are part of this program in 4 Departments in Haiti
- Johnny Gryglewicz has been working with Classis SE and Resonate (Marco Avila) on ordaining
 Haitian Pastors and planting churches. At the last Classis meeting, they had an examination and
 pass for Pastor Leclaire. Pastor Leclaire's church has around 100 people and he would like it to
 be a CRC church. The next Classis meeting was set to have 3 more Haitian Pastors examined.
 They also finalized an ordination curriculum to help these pastors.
- Johnny's sister recently had a baby and the family was able to fly up to New York to visit.
- Kim Gryglewicz took a job as an Assistant Principal at Bradenton Christian School and things have been going well!
